III. New Business/Discussion

A. <u>Legislative Issues and Technical Infrastructure</u>

The need for state-wide broadband was reemphasized. Not only do rural students suffer, students who reside in more populous areas suffer as well due the lack of reliability. This concern also directly connects to a larger economic/industrial problem at the statewide level.

B. Institutional and Faculty Adaption to Covid

Faculty believe that there should be a more concerted effort to inform institutional and legislative leaders about the innovate adaptions that have been employed in order to help alleviate many of the problems surrounding Covid. Improved broadband, it was noted, would further help educators facilitate their classes. Some concerns about campus safety (as it pertains to Covid) were raised, as well.

C. <u>Textbook Affordability</u>

It was noted that many of our institutions receive revenue from campus bookstores, which in the end works to discourage students from purchasing course materials from other retailers, which could potentially save them money. Because financial aid vouchers can only be used to purchase materials from institutional bookstores, student options are limited. Open Educational Resources (OER) were discussed as a viable option.
